

## Statement on RSA BSAFE Products Section 508 Compliance

RSA Security, Inc. products generally meet the “Section 508” technical and performance standards of 36 C.F.R. §§ 1194.21-1194.41. RSA BSAFE® products are designed to interact with common EIT (Electronic and Information Technology) systems and with common EIT applications, including Assistive Technology, used in those systems; our products operate through operating system interfaces and do not actively disable Assistive Technology in ways known to us.

RSA BSAFE products, however, are intended for software developers rather than software end-users. Some requirements of § 1194.21 may therefore be inapplicable or not met. More importantly, RSA BSAFE products do not disable, override, or supercede accessibility features placed in software products by a developer, or added by an end-user of a developer’s software product.

RSA BSAFE products therefore will not impede a software developer’s ability to certify compliance with the following GSA solicitation requirement, or similar solicitation requirements:

*“All electronic and information technology (EIT) procured through this Statement of Work/Bill of Materials and any resulting contract, task order, delivery order, or purchase order must meet the applicable accessibility standards at 36 CFR 1194, unless an agency exception to this requirement exists. 36 CFR 1194 implements Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, and is viewable here. The contractor shall indicate for each line item in the schedule whether each product or service is compliant or noncompliant with the accessibility standards at 36 CFR 1194. Further, the proposal must indicate where full details of compliance can be found (e.g., vendor's website or other exact location).”*

This statement is to the best of RSA Security’s knowledge and belief, and must evolve with the development and release of new Assistive Technologies, and with new Guide, Tutorial, or other explanatory materials released by the Access Board at [www.access-board.gov](http://www.access-board.gov).
